The Child Care Law Center is a nonprofit firm that uses legal expertise to ensure that low-income children are cared for in high-quality settings, so parents can work without worrying about their children's wellbeing. We educate parents and child care providers, advise advocates and policymakers, provide legal information and referrals, and litigate high-impact cases.

We are the **only legal organization in the country** devoted exclusively to the complex issues of child care law, which encompass disability law, education law, public benefits, regulatory law, housing, zoning and land use.

We use legal expertise to improve child care funding, policies, and availability – particularly for children of color, children with disabilities, and low-income families. Our impact work achieves equity for young children in child care and for the child care professionals who care for them.

We welcome law students who are interested in civil rights, women's issues, and education to join our staff and work side-by-side with our attorneys. We provide a welcoming, supportive work environment and hands-on supervision. Law clerks will get experience in drafting legal and

legislative memoranda, answering legal questions from parents and child care professionals, and legislative advocacy.
